

DIRECT LAB ACCESS TESTING

A Patient's Guide

At Glacial Ridge Hospital, certain lab tests are available without a physician's order. Direct Lab Access (DLA) is consumer-directed laboratory testing and may be of particular interest to those patients whose health insurance plans do not cover certain wellness, screening, or health maintenance tests.

Convenient:

Testing is available Monday - Friday from 8a - 4p. Go directly to the Laboratory to register, you do not need to stop at the hospital or outreach reception desks, and select the test(s) you want from the DLA test menu (on the back).

- Anyone under 18 years of age must be accompanied by a parent or guardian.
- Please have a picture ID available at the time of service.

Results:

All test results are confidential and are not sent to your healthcare provider. They do NOT become part of your medical record. You may wait for your results (please allow up to 2 hours), pick them up, or have them mailed to you.

Take charge of your health:

You are encouraged to share your results with your health care provider and are responsible for contacting a physician if you have questions, receive abnormal results or feel unwell. Your current health and complete medical history must be considered when evaluating your health status.

Payment:

All DLA tests must be paid for at the time of service with cash, check or credit card. We do not file insurance claims or send bills for these services.
